This is the twenty fourth of an annual series of lectures to honour those who have made an outstanding contribution to the treatment and study of chronic pain. This year's lecture honours **Ulf Lindblom** and the meeting will be chaired by **Chris Wells** and **Roger Knaggs**.

Ulf Lindblom, was Professor of Neurology at the Karolinska Institute, Stockholm, Sweden. He was regarded by his peers as an outstanding clinical bedside neurologist. He was a founding member and president of IASP and pioneered quantitative sensory testing. A short appreciation of his life and work will be given by **Per Hansson**, who is a senior neurology consultant, specializing in neurology and pain medicine at the Department of Pain Management and Research of the Karolinska Institute.

Professor Andrew Rice is a clinical academic who for more than 35 years has been intrigued by the conundrum of neuropathic pain. He is Professor of Pain Research at Imperial College and the current President of the International Association for the Study of Pain (IASP). Andrew has been privileged to receive multiple awards including Imperial College's Lifetime Achievement Award for Excellence in Animal Research, and the Patrick Wall Lecturer at the British Pain Society. He has authored over 250 publications, many of them in leading specialist journals.
